OPEN DAYS FOR FAIR DONATIONS

Saturday 3rd March 1-3pm | Saturday 17th March 1-3pm

Furniture items will be accepted the week before the Fair (due to space can't take bigger items until then). You don't need to wait until the weekend open days to drop off your quality items. Parents, family and friends can drop off car loads, bags or boxes of items directly to Room 30, which acts as the sorting room.

THE PROCESS TO DROP OFF ITEMS DURING THE WEEK...

Numbers are placed on the ground on the courts by Room 30. These numbers represent the children's room numbers. Donations can be placed beside each room number, and this ensures points get assigned to your child's room. Items can be dropped off from 8.30am.

If you have a lot of items and need vehicle access, you can ring the office when you arrive at the gate and ask them to buzz you in to drop off your items.

Donations can also be dropped off any time during school hours, however the

room numbers on the courts will be taken away at morning tea time when it starts getting busy.

If the sorting room is unattended, please leave donations on the small deck of **Room 30** and write class room numbers on the bags/boxes.

Large plates, trays, bowls, vases, beauty/pamper products,

QUICKFIRE RAFFLES

Grocery items - biscuits, nuts, chocolate, tea and coffee, sauces, oils, cereal, pasta, wine and soft drinks. Jewellery, books, toys, sporting items, baby products

TOYS

Puzzles, games, dolls and accessories, cars, trucks, puppets, lego, duplo, pencil cases, ride on toys, handbags, educational toys, blocks, farm animals, transformers, train sets, craft activities, role play toys

WHITE ELEPHANT

Baskets, buckets, hoses, tools, wall art, bowls, cutlery, torches, brooms, weed eaters, leaf blowers, plastic containers,

gardening equipment, Christmas decorations, back packs, suitcases, cots, bassinets, highchairs, pushchairs, change tables, computers, printers

SOFT TOYS/BABY

And plates, cups, bottles, rattles, back and front packs, jolly jumpers

BRIC A BRAC

Cups and saucers, plates, dinner sets, jugs, bowls, glasses, ornaments, vases, wall prints and collectable items

JAMS AND PRESERVES

Homemade – lemon honey, tomato sauce, jams, chutneys, clean/empty jars – 400gm size

PLANTS

Potting mix, seeds, pot plant holders, plants, gardening tools

SPORT

Camping equipment, balls, tennis and squash racquets, kites, boots, snow equipment, boogie boards, cycling equipment, hockey sticks, skateboards, bikes, scooters, sports clothing

FABRIC, CRAFT AND GIFTS

Plus dress-up clothes Entertainment DVD's, CD's, computer games, CD racks, musical instruments and music systems

ELECTRICAL

Toasters, vacuum cleaners, rice cookers, cake mixers, microwaves, bread makers, jugs, lights and lamps, heaters
